A Living History

Consequently, we have had to rely on bits and pieces of information that have been maintained by individual members, as well as the printed record copies of the official LITPC newsletter, "The Trading Post". We are unable to provide 100% documentation of the individuals who have served over the years on the LITPC Board of Directors. Also, we are no doubt missing some of the details of significant events that have affected the organization over the years. We have tried our best to give you an honest and unbiased accounting of the LITPC based on many hours of research and discussions with as many people that we were privileged to have known over the years.

The LITPC is a dynamic organization and the constant changes and new events will need to be documented as the years go by. It is our hope that this accounting will continue in what we envision as a "living history" of the LITPC. It has been accepted by many that a true history of any organization cannot be accomplished for at least 100 years after the fact. That time frame helps to eliminate the biased reporting of facts that can invariably creep into such an accounting. However, to achieve that, it is absolutely essential that we begin the process so that others who follow will have a better basis upon which to present their accounting.
