

#### Chapter 6



#### Campaign Sight First II Project


During the 2007 Chicago LCI convention, the LITPC Board of Directors approved an ambitious project proposed by newly elected President **Larry Shaull** of Pennsylvania to raise a minimum of \$50,000.00 that would go to the ongoing LCI *Campaign Sight First II (CSF II) Project*. Never in the history of the LITPC had such a commitment been made that would require the cooperation of the entire pin trading community. President Larry outlined the types of goals that he would request of the several multiple district pin trading clubs. The fantastic results are summarized in this chapter primarily through the extensive use of pictures, including those that show the items that were generated to raise funds to make the LITPC goal possible. In this connection, the LITPC goal was doubled to \$100,000.00 within the first few months when it became evident to President Larry that the pin traders enthusiasm for the project assured our being able to meet such a lofty goal.

Although the LCI official fund-raising aspect of the *CSF II Project* came to a close at the 2008 LCI Convention in Bangkok, Thailand, it was recognized that there would be some entities within Lionism that would continue their efforts until their pledges were achieved. This recognition certainly accommodated the LITPC efforts since it was our intention all along to present a single check to the Lions Clubs International Foundation at the 2009 LCI Convention in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

President of Lions Clubs International, Lion **Al Brandel** of New York, attended the 2009 LITPC Annual Breakfast in Minneapolis primarily to receive the LITPC check for *CSF II*. Accompanying President Brandel were Past International Presidents **Frank Moore** and Dr. **Tae-Sup Lee**. The actual amount of the check, which was presented on behalf of the LITPC was \$143,000.00. This exceeded our goal and pledge to LCI by \$43,000.00. Although this tremendous accomplishment can be attributed to the efforts of the entire pin trading community, it cannot be denied that without the constant urging and leadership of President Larry Shaull, this would not have been possible. In recognition of his outstanding leadership and his dedication to the project, LCI President Brandel presented Shaull with the prestigious Lion Friends of Humanity Award. In addition, President Larry received the International Presidents Award. The presentations are shown below and on the next several pages.



Increase in Projected Goal. During an LITPC Board Meeting held in conjunction with the Pin Traders Club of Virginia 28th Pin Swap in Winchester, Virginia, President Larry Shaull announced that based on the initial response from all corners of the pin trading community, he was confident that a more realistic goal for this project would be a pledge of \$100,000.00. This represented a 100% increase in the original goal. Although the actual LCI program ended in June 2008, It was agreed that a single LITPC check for the amount collected would be presented in 2009 by President Larry to the President of LCI as a part of the LITPC Annual Meeting at the LCI Convention in Minneapolis. In recognition of this significant pledge, President Larry received this letter from PIP Tac-Sup Lee, in his role as Chairperson for CSF II.

**LITPC Quilt.** President **Larry Shaull** announced that an anonymous quilter was in the process of finishing a beautiful quilt that she was willing to donate, and one which would be used as the ultimate prize in a raffle sponsored by the LITPC. Further, all of the net profits raised through this raffle (over \$15,000) would go toward the LITPC share of the \$100,000.00 goal. Each member of the Board was given a minimum of 100 tickets to sell and then each multiple district pin trading club was asked to accept raffle tickets to sell. This effort would be over and above any other fund-raisers that the clubs may choose to initiate toward meeting their agreed goals.

There is no doubt that every individual who has served as the president of the LITPC can pick out one or two outstanding events and accomplishments that happened during their two year term. Certainly, PDG Larry Shaull will forever be known as the president who conceived of the idea to raise this type of money for a charitable cause. The important thing about this is that the charity is not just any charity, it is one that is devoted exclusively to helping the Lions eradicate blindness throughout the world. It is hoped that as a side benefit, the Lions of the world will once and for all be able to see tangible evidence that the pin trading community is truly one that works and contributes for the good of mankind.

Here is a miniature picture of the quilt that was eventually won by Lion **Dan Ryan**, New York, in a drawing held during the 2009 LITPC Annual Meeting in Minneapolis. The quilt is 105 inches square and is called "*Luncheon in the Butterfly Garden*." In ceremonies during the Annual Meeting, Mrs. **Penny Sharpe**, Virginia, was among those who received the prestigious Melvin Jones Fellow honor. Breaking the silence on the identity of the quilter, President Larry Shaull revealed that Mrs. Sharpe was indeed the quilter and that she is the wife of one of our most active members from Virginia, Lion **Phil Sharpe**.
