The Wild West Shows

Featuring THE ICONIC WILL ROGERS STANDING ON THE BACK OF A LONGHORN STEER

William Penn Adair Rogers was born on 4 November 1879 as a citizen of the Cherokee Nation in Indian Territory, which is now part of Oklahoma. He traveled around the world, made 50 silent films and 21 “talkies”. He was also a renowned writer and wrote more than 4,000 nationally syndicated newspaper columns. He died tragically on 15 August 1935 in an airplane crash near Point Barrow, Alaska.

Multiple District 3, Oklahoma, has honored this “Favorite Son of Oklahoma” with their 2024-25 trading pins shown above.
