American History Circa 1800s

Lion John Leggett of the U.K. suggested that it might be appropriate to report on an incident that happened at the beginning of the U.S. Civil War. The incident was truly wild even though it didn't happen in the Wild West. It was the kind of stuff that created legends during the 1800s, regardless of its location. It concerns the awarding of the newly approved (1862) Congressional Medal of Honor. When you have some spare time, you might want to read the article about the incident that we have paraphrased and attached on the next page.

MEET THE MAN WHO CONDUCTED THE FIRST MILITARY ACTION TO MERIT AMERICA'S HIGHEST MILITARY AWARD THE CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR Corporal Francis E. Brownell

When America descended into the Civil War in April of 1861, Francis Brownell enlisted in the Union's 11th New York Volunteers, known as the "Fire Zouaves" It was modeled after the French units of North Africa. Corporal Brownell was under the command of Colonel Elmer Ellsworth, a personal friend of U. S. President Abraham Lincoln.

The Zouaves were stationed in Washington, D.C. and on May 23, 1861, when Virginia seceded from the Union, a state of war existed between Virginia and the Union. The only thing between Virginia and Washington, D.C. was the Potomac River. Alexandria was the closest and most prominent Virginia community near the U.S. Capital. Colonel Ellsworth was directed to enter Alexandria to assist in the occupation of the city. Soon after entering the city, Colonel Ellsworth's troops encountered no resistance whatsoever. Marching down the middle of a street in the city, Colonel Ellsworth noticed a large Confederate flag atop what was later identified as an inn called Marshall House. Since his troops were recognized as an aggressive and unruly bunch by normal military standards, the Colonel decided that to avoid any trouble, it was best to take immediate action to remove the flag. As he and four of his troops entered the Inn, they encountered the innkeeper, James W. Jackson. Unbeknown to the Colonel, Jackson was a strong supporter of the southern cause, particularly on the subject of slavery. The Colonel asked Jackson "who put that flag up". The man answered "I don't know I'm just a boarder here." With that, the Colonel and his men proceeded to the roof of the Inn and cut the flag down. As they were coming down the stairs, Jackson by this time had a shotgun pointed directly at the Colonel. He pulled the trigger and Colonel Ellsworth was killed instantly. To protect himself and to avenge the Colonel's shooting, Corporal Brownell raised his musket and, at point blank range, shot and killed Jackson instantly. Brownell became known as "Ellsworth's Avenger."

This tragic event set the scene of the first action of the American Civil War that resulted in the death of a Union officer. The New York Times reported that Brownell, "With the quickness of lighting leveled his musket at Jackson and fired. The ball struck Jackson on the bridge of his nose and crashed through his skull killing him instantly. As Jackson fell Brownell followed his shot by a thrust of his bayonet which went through Jackson's body."

Colonel Ellsworth's body was taken to the White House where it lay in state before being taken to New York City. Thousands of New Yorkers filed past the casket of their hero. "Remember Ellsworth" became a Union rallying cry. One side's villain is another's hero, and this became apparent as Jackson, the innkeeper, became a hero in the south. A book was published in 1862, "The Life of James W. Jackson, the Alexandria Hero."

After multiple appeals by the supporters of Corporal Francis E. Brownell, the United States Congress approved the awarding of the Congressional Medal of Honor to Brownell. The citation read "Rank and organization: Corporal, Company A, 11th New York Infantry. Place and date. Alexandria, VA, May 24, 1861. Entered service at Troy, N.Y. Birth: New York, date of issue January 26, 1877. Killed the southern sympathizer who shot Colonel Elmer E. Ellsworth at the Marshall House, Alexandria VA, after that state had declared its secession from the Union".

Our thanks to our fellow pin trader, *Lion John Leggett* of the U.K., for calling our attention to this "Wild West" type of military action. Truly, an integral part of American history, Circa 1800.
